



SESSION UPDATES

At January's meeting, Session:

- Met with deacons and discussed security concerns in the Presbytery.
- Appointed a Security Task Force of representatives of the Buildings and Grounds, Personnel, Outreach/Fellowship and F&A committees (Clay, Randy, Tom & Chris respectively) to research the security issue and create a security policy and procedure.
- Noted that a women's choir will be using the sanctuary on Monday nights starting in February.
- Approved Ray McKean, staff, and Darlene Higgenbottom, treasurer, as Corresponding Members for 2024.
- Examined incoming elders and deacons.
- Noted the following were ordained and/or installed on January 21, 2024: Elders Clay Morgan, Spencer Magnusson, and Chris Ulum (ordained); Deacons Barb Jones, Dick and Kate Eyberg. Dave Tomastik (deacon-elect) was unable to attend and will be installed at a later date.
- Regretfully accepted the request from John Graf to be removed from MPC membership. Membership stands at 130.
- Noted the Session Retreat is February 17, 2024, 12:30pm 5:00pm at church.
- Elected Darlene Higgenbottom to serve as Treasurer of MPC for 2024.
- Elected Karen Black to serve as Clerk of Session of MPC for 2024.
- Elected Chris Ulum as President and Karen Black as Secretary of MPC for 2024.
- Elected Kate England and Jenifer Aberle to serve as Session representatives to the 2024 Nominating Committee.
- Approved serving communion on the first Sunday of each month and Good Friday (Mar. 29).
- Agreed to request Presbytery allow a delay in payment of budgeted, per capita apportionment, on an installment basis with payment completed by September 30, 2024. Per member amount: \$45.60.
- Approved the 2024 Counting Procedures Policy.
- Approved the 2023 Annual Statistical Report to General Assembly.
- Agreed to add **non-binary** to the membership tracking spreadsheet. Non-binary is an option for gender distribution on the annual statistical report. Options are male, female, and non-binary.
- Noted there are 46 pledges for the 2024 budget covering above 70% of the budget, which is in line with previous budgets.
- Approved the 2024 MPC Budget as proposed.
- Noted that Heather Hellman has been accepted and affirmed by the CRE (Commissioned Ruling Elder) Committee.

REFUGEE CARE COLLECTIVE WASHCLOTH SETS TO BE COLLECTED IN FEBRUARY & MARCH

Refugees arrive in Oregon with few possessions and have to quickly build their lives again.

The **Collective** works to provide critical support through essential household items to 125 newly arriving families in the coming months. These families will arrive through the U.S. Refugee Resettlement Program and most will arrive from Afghanistan, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, and Ukraine.

The current inventory of these essential items is low, so we have would like to again support this organization by **collecting a minimum of 50 sets of 6-8 washcloths in February and March** as part of the Refugee Care Church Response. 
