SESSION UPDATE

Session met on March 25 for its monthly meeting. At the meeting:

- Session approved the creation of a designated fund for the purpose of Open Door maintenance & equipment that will also receive donations related to pickleball.
- Tom Base was approved by Session as a back-up check signer.
- Session agreed to accept the donation of a Baldwin grand piano from friend of MPC/marimba ensemble member Karin Chesnutt that will be used in place of the current piano. MPC will keep the current piano for now. Thank you, Karin!
- Session renewed its covenants with Heather Hellman, CRE and Rev. Dr. Jennifer Ackerman for 2025 on the same terms as the previous year, except with a 3.7% increase in compensation already accounted for in the 2025 budget.
- Session approved two agreements related to the easement trail that passes over MPC. These agreements formalize the trail and articulate, in addition to other things, maintenance responsibilities for the organization SW Trails.
- Building & Grounds shared a document with Session discussing various safety and security measures and prospective policies. This document is still being edited and parts or all of it may be formalized at some point in the future.

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION

February was a close to break-even month, and through the first two months of 2025 we are "in the black", with income exceeding expenses by \$942.

PASTOR TERMINOLOGY 101

So what is a "called and installed" pastor? In the Presbyterian Church, the "installed" pastoral relationships are pastor, co-pastor, and associate pastor. A minister of the Word and Sacrament may be "installed" in a pastoral relationship for an indefinite period, or for a designated term determined by the presbytery in consultation with the congregation. This "indefinite" period and the contractual terms that go with it are the fundamental elements of an "installed" pastor.

The "called" aspect comes from the congregation. When a congregation determines that its strategy for mission under the Word so requires, the congregation may "call" for a pastor or additional pastors. Such additional pastors are called co-pastors or associate pastors, and the duties of each pastor and the relationship between the pastors of the congregation shall be determined by the session with the approval of the presbytery.

For over 100 years at Multnomah Presbyterian Church, the called & installed pastoral relationship made sense. However, in the 2020's things look much different. As noted last month, the typical tenure of pastoral service is currently only about 3 to 4 years. Because of this, many Presbyterian Churches have migrated to different pastoral arrangements from the traditional "called & installed" due to the churn and effort involved in mission studies, searches, declining membership, multiple searches, and a reduced Pastoral supply pool.

The Book of Order criteria for readiness to begin ordered ministry as a minister of the Word and Sacrament include:

- **a.** a candidate's wisdom and maturity of faith, leadership skills, compassionate spirit, honest repute, and sound judgment;
- **b.** a transcript showing graduation, with satisfactory grades, at a regionally accredited college or university;
- c. a transcript from an accredited theological institution showing study including Hebrew and Greek; and
- **d.** examination materials, prepared and administered by a body created by the presbyteries.

The criteria for Pastoral leadership are comparable for temporary leadership as well as called & installed pastors. Having the qualifications is independent of "calls" and "installing". Because of this, Presbyterian Churches are now working within the range of pastoral titles (designated, temporary, Commissioned Ruling Elder) to establish relationships that work for today's congregations and pastoral marketplace. For example, designated supply and CRE can be three-year contracts, which can be renewed (rather than "indefinite" installation). These more flexible approaches adapt to a new way of looking at stability.

This is where the Session of Multnomah Presbyterian Church is today. We are exploring, evaluating, and patiently experiencing where the God's wind is leading us, and adapting to a world where an installed pastor is unlikely to stay 20-30 years.

ALASKA ADVENTURE AUCTION

Meanwhile, our Skagway kids and youth get a rare opportunity to experience VBS and youth groups during a time when the adults of the town are busy earning their living for the year. We will be fundraising again for the trip with our Auction and Lunch on May 4th. 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BUILDINGS & GROUNDS

Greetings MPC Family - Here's what we've been up to recently:

• The entire B&G Team met at Old Market Pub for a luncheon to bid farewell to Karen Black and celebrate her years of service.



- The Astragal (aka: a piece of metal) was installed on the downstairs double doors. The section of metal adds to the security of these doors. (Picture left: note the gray metal down the middle of the doors)
- All Emergency Exit signs and lights were tested & inspected.
- Two back up batteries were replaced, and the lighting fixture over the main fireside entry was replaced.
- The main entry doors were adjusted, such that all are not sticking and all close completely now.
- The SW Trails Easement Document was finalized, presented to and reviewed by Session at the March meeting.
- The MPC Security Document is in the process of being reviewed by B&G, Deacons, and Fellowship Committees, and items within the document will be edited as needed before being presented to the Session for final review and approval.
- B&G is also working on maps and signage to be posted in the building that shows exit routes, First Aid Kits, and AED device locations.
- Traffic cones were placed in two areas on the property, to assist in preventing further property



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SW PORTLAND SUNDAY PARKWAYS

The Parks and Recreation event Sunday Parkways, which encourages the whole community to come out and walk and bike the neighborhood streets together, is back on **May 18th**. For the past two years we have manned two neighboring intersections on the route. At those intersections we help people safely navigate sharp turns, redirect cars that need to get in and out of the neighborhood despite road closures, and we have provided a fun festival atmosphere. We love the opportunity to meet and serve our neighbors!

CAN WE OPEN THE OPEN DOOR TO ALL OUR NEIGHBORS?

The Open Door has been an open welcoming place for youth for decades, and now it is also open to pickleball players. Amazing moments of grace and care happen in that building everyday as people experience the love of Jesus while they have fun. People find rest there, play, community, and so much more. We get to watch people encounter Jesus's love through this amazing resource of fun we have as a church.

Recently we have begun thinking about whether it could be a place where our houseless neighbors could also find community, care, grace, and recreation - things they desperately need. We have talked to local organizations Street Roots and SW Outreach about this idea and how we might implement it in a way that is safe, respectful, and serves our homeless neighbors well. Both organizations have provided us with action steps and resources, as well as a promise of ongoing support. The proposal is for one Wednesday afternoon a month, which coordinates with another service nearby so our neighbors don't have to find additional transportation to come.

In order to do this, we'll need a team of volunteers that are willing to be present for this ministry. We need people willing to play board games, pickleball, basketball, or just sit and talk over a cup of tea. We are looking into the recommended training for de-escalation and other safety elements to help us be safe and well equipped to serve. If you are interested in participating in this training and being a volunteer once a month, please contact Heather. We have a great opportunity to share the wealth of fun and love we experience at the Open Door with neighbors that very, very rarely get the opportunity for safe, healthy recreation, but we can't do that without you.


