One of the ways we have done this is by connecting with the community of protestors and organizations that gather at the facility in the South Waterfront neighborhood. These actions help us build community as we stand together and try to respond throughout our community to help our neighbors most impacted by ICE presence in Portland. 

SESSION UPDATE

Session met in person on January 20th for its stated monthly meeting. Session met jointly with the deacons for the first part of the meeting and welcomed the new officers for 2026, who were installed on January 18.

The deacons and Session discussed building security during Sunday services, potential deescalation training, and incorporating the deacons into scripture reading and serving communion.

The next stated Presbytery meeting is on Thursday, January 29, online via Zoom, at 6:00pm. Session did not elect any commissioners.

A Session retreat is scheduled for Saturday, February 21, which will include a discussion of questions from the Presbytery's ongoing mission study.

Session heard ministry reports and approved the following annual business:

- to elect Darlene Higgenbottom to serve as Treasurer of MPC for 2026
- to elect Lisa Shelley to serve as Clerk of Session of MPC for 2026
- to elect Chris Ulum as President and Lisa Shelley as Secretary of MPC for 2026
- to approve serving communion at MPC on the first Sunday of each month in 2026
- to approve the Annual Statistical Report for 2025 for submission to the Presbytery
- to elect Janet Lowrey (as chair) and Spencer Magnusson to the Congregational Nominating Committee for 2026
- to approve end of year transfers of remaining budgeted funds from 2025
- to approve the final 2026 budget
- to approve per capita and Presbyterian Partnership Giving for 2026
- to approve the Pastor/Head of Staff Covenant with Heather for 2026
