Come celebrate the many blessings of MPC from the past year with us. Snacks will be available before the meeting begins.

NURSERY UPDATE & OPPORTUNITY

As we plan for 2023, our hope is to move closer to restoring the level of programming we offered pre-COVID by re-opening the Nursery for families with young children. The amazing Building & Grounds team has given the space a much needed update to

make it feel welcoming and safe, as well as up to date with the ability to stream the worship service. Walls have been painted and a new padded flooring system was installed, which will keep our little ones safe as they explore, whether they are crawlers or new walkers. We added new chairs for the adults, as well as a fun exploration center which was mounted on the wall. And as we move further into 2023 we hope to hire staff to help with Sunday morning care, so with the safety, visual and technology improvements the space will look warm and inviting to young families.

Most of this nursery upgrade was paid for from a Building & Grounds designated fund. If you are interested in contributing to that fund to "refill the well," shall we say, you may send a check with "Building and Grounds Designated Fund" on the memo line to help complete this project. This will help the Building and Grounds Team continue to update other areas of our church. Thank you for your support with this project!







MISSIONS MINISTRY

On December 12th, MPC was able to deliver 77 cold weather kits, 31 sleeping bags, and assorted other loose items to HOMEpdx to be distributed to our unsheltered neighbors during the Christmas season. Thank you so much for helping assemble kits, bringing in items, and for your generosity to MPC, which made this possible! It was a fun event and HOMEpdx was SO grateful.

In January, the Mission Committee will also be taking 48 children's winter coats to Northwest Children's Outreach for children in need.

- hear from refugees who fled wars and genocide before arriving in Portland, Oregon.

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION

F&A Committee met on December 20th, 2022 to review our latest financial reports and continue the budget process for 2023. Budget performances for the month of November and the first 11 months of 2022 are outlined below. Heather Hellman sat in representing the staff and will do so for now until we have a permanent pastor.

We ended November with an account balance of \$285,794. Overall, we have a balanced budget for the year.

BUILDING THE 2023 BUDGET

We reviewed a summary of pledges coming in on a weekly basis. As of the Coffeehouse weekend we were slightly ahead of the giving at the same time last year. That said, we are still about \$20,000 below last year's total. If you have not yet pledged, it is not too late. Every little bit helps to insure we are able to build our true mission into the budget and activities we support in 2023.

In early January we will update the draft budget based on the pledges and status of our pastor search, and provide the final budget proposal to Session for consideration and approval.

LONG TERM FINANCIAL PLANNING

As we are sure you have noticed, our numbers have been gradually dwindling over time. F&A has begun to discuss possible longer-term plans that are consistent with our mission to serve Christ while remaining good stewards of the resources we have been given. As is turns out, there are many small struggling churches that are having difficulty finding a place to worship together. Other churches, including ours, were built for larger congregations. This results in challenging budgets and wasted space.

We have formed a small exploration group to assess the market for leasing some of our space for worship or activities of other Christian groups. Dennis Zerba, Amy Clements, and Roy Magnusson will be screening interested groups and discussing lease options. Rest assured that we will not move forward without Session approval and congregational discussion on any such project. We are hopeful that we can find a win/win situation where we can help our brothers and sisters in Christ by sharing resources while maintaining our sense of community and ownership.

Finally, on behalf of the F&A Committee, we wish you a very Happy New Year.


Heather, meanwhile, was in charge managing Ray's expectations and finding a cast for the play. And let's just say she experienced some... interesting auditions.

- Replaced Sanctuary Video Projector Lamps.


