We have many people in our church who have entered the retirement stage of life, have time off work in the summer, or just don't know what to do with all their spare time. Volunteering is a great way to make a concrete, positive difference in our hectic world. Here are some of our favorite volunteering ideas to consider:

• **American Red Cross** – Blood donations can help save lives, as every 2 seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood. Currently, there is an urgent need for platelet donations which help people battling cancer. The platelet donation process can last up to 3 hours, but includes a TV monitor, headphones, and every streaming service available. Plus, the Oreos! https://RedCross.org

• **CASA/GAL volunteers** – Court Appointed Special Advocate® (CASA) and guardian ad litem (GAL) volunteers advocate on behalf of children who have experienced abuse or neglect. Their best-interest advocacy helps ensure that children are safe, have a permanent home and have the opportunity to thrive. CASA/GAL volunteers are regular people, from all walks of life, who have been rigorously screened and trained extensively by their local program. https://oregoncasanetwork.org/get-involved

• **Meals on Wheels** – it is not only preparing or delivering meals; volunteers are also needed for friendly wellness chats, which can be done via phone. Find information for our local Meals on Wheels at https://www.mowp.org/volunteer/

• **Blanchet House** serves anyone who comes to their doors without judgment. Founded by U. of Portland alumna, they believe everyone deserves food, clothes, community, and hope. For all volunteer opportunities, please visit https://blanchethouse.org/

• **Providence Center for Medically Fragile Children** - When a child has profound disabilities and requires complex medical care, families can feel overwhelmed, despite their unwavering love. Volunteers and staff at the Center for Medically Fragile Children at Providence Child Center provide an extension of that family. We give children opportunities to play, cuddle, laugh and learn. It is a profound experience for our volunteers and a labor of love for all of us. Volunteer opportunities include working directly with a specific child; assisting with field trips, recreational programs and water activities, special events and parties, as well as helping the children get on and off their school buses. https://www.providence.org/locations/or/providence-child-center/volunteering

• **Faithful Friends** – They match volunteer individuals, couples, or families as mentors to kids ages 6 through 9. The mentor/mentee matches meet 3-4 times each month and commit to at least 1 year. • Good Neighbor House/Center (Tigard) - Serves families with children experiencing

F&A Committee met on June 21, 2022 to review the financial reports and discuss a number of agenda items as outlined below. Budget performance for the first five months of 2022 is positive as outlined here:

In June, the Mission Committee welcomed two visitors from PEB, the Presbyterian Education Board of Pakistan, to educate us about their ministry. PCUSA owns more than two dozen schools in Pakistan in the Punjab region that provide an alternative to the government-run and Muslim schools. These schools are extremely well-respected in the area and provide education opportunities for girls as well as allowing Christian and Muslim students to study side-by-side. Pakistan is less than 3% Christian, but these schools are having a big influence, as well as providing an environment where extremist Islam and the Taliban cannot spread.
