The Mission Committee is going to be hosting another lunch for Portland's unsheltered community in partnership with HOMEpdx on **Sunday, October 9th**. We need volunteers to come the day before at 11am to do some cooking, we need volunteers Sunday morning before and after the church service to help prep and pack the meal, and we need volunteers to serve with us at the East Bank Esplanade.

HOMEpdx does a lunch like this every Sunday and has a regular group of very grateful, very hungry people who come to eat. Serving begins at 1PM and we are usually packed up and ready to leave by 2PM at the latest. We serve in a covered area right off the parking lot. Some volunteers will fill plates, some will pass them around or offer drinks or desserts. This has been a wonderful experience in the past and we encourage everyone to consider participating.

## **SESSION UPDATE**

At their last meeting, Session:

- Removed Karen Altman from membership at her request, with regret.
- Authorized, via email vote on Aug. 31, a \$500 donation to St. Andrews Presbyterian Church from Designated Fund #331 Discretionary Mission following their break-in and vandalism
- Decided to continue to meet via zoom
- Authorized Heather Hellman to be head of staff until the temporary pastor begins work at MPC.
- Authorized an increase in staff pay as follows: 10% increase for Heather and Ray, and up to 40 hours per week for Vicki if needed (normally she works 28), all beginning Sept. 12 and continuing until the end of the month in which the temporary pastor begins, with a minimum of two weeks after the pastor's start date.
- Approved to offer two services on Christmas Eve (4 pm and 7:30 pm) and a pre-recorded service on Christmas Day.
- Approved November 20, 2022 to be Pledge Sunday, with a Stewardship letter being mailed to the congregation in October.
- Approved the position description for the temporary pastor who will be asked to be an interim pastor for 6 12 months, with the understanding there will not be a mission study at the church.
- Approved Adrienne Gassaway for baptism and MPC active 11:15am Noon membership by profession of faith, to be held on Oct. 2, 2022 during the worship service with Heather Hellman and Jennifer Ackerman presiding.
- Approved the following slate of nominees for the PNC to be presented to the congregation for election: Jesse Black, John England, Dick Eyberg, Adrienne Gassaway, Valentine Hellman, Lisa Shelley, Courtney Tomastik, Nancy Unrath.

# **FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION**

F&A Committee met on September 20th, 2022 to review our latest financial reports and begin the budget process for 2023. Budget performances for the month of August and the first eight months of 2022 are outlined below. Heather Hellman sat in representing the staff and will do so for now until we have a permanent pastor.

We ended the month with an account balance of \$299,338. Overall, we have a balanced budget for the year.

We have begun the budget process with spreadsheets going out to the elders for initial requests. F&A is compiling a list of items that will need discussion and decision. Worksheets will be gathered and reviewed in October. We will share the preliminary plan with the congregation in November and finalize it in January 2023 at Session. We will be including estimates of the cost of recruitment of our new pastor.

We will be meeting in October to continue the process of developing the budget for 2023 and how to best support the Pastor selection process.

## DEACON NEWS FOR YOU MEET YOUR DEACON

This month's spotlight is on **Christie Sargent**, who is in her second year as a Deacon.

In her own words -

Autumn days seem to always fill me with a kind of wistfulness and/or nostalgia, so it is a good time for me to share with you a little about myself. I grew up in Billings, Montana with an older brother and much younger sister. My dad was the first surgeon in Montana and my mother was a very accomplished pianist. But most importantly they were committed Christians. My mother was the church pianist, so we sat on the front row every Sunday. Even with my brother pinching me, we didn't make a peep because we knew the service was a live radio broadcast! When I was eight years old my Sunday School teacher led me to give my heart to Jesus.

High school found me at a Christian boarding school in Florida. Although I was extremely homesick, I think it may have initiated my love of travel. I attended college in Indiana, Michigan and Massachusetts. Moving to Oregon as a new bride began my "real" adult life. I briefly taught speech and drama at George Fox University. When my son and daughter were 5 and 7 years old, I went through the heartache of divorce. Up until then I was a stay-at-home mom. Needing to support myself and my children, I got my Oregon teaching license and taught 6th grade for North Clackamas School District until 2003.

Throughout those years I changed churches several times because of my children. Being a single parent and wearing a lot of hats, I wanted my children to be involved in church activities and youth programs so that they could be with other adults and kids their age that made faith and trust in the Lord a priority.

A few years ago, one of my dearest friends, Libby, invited me to come to Laurel Neal's Tuesday morning Bible study. That was such a blessing to me that I just kept getting more and more involved at MPC. Everyone has been so welcoming and kind! Thank you!

## Congregational Nominating Committee Recommendation Form

Dear Members and Friends of MPC,

Fall is here and that means it's time to nominate those who will serve our church as a Deacon or an Elder beginning in January 2023. Elders and deacons have been vital to the ministry of the church since shortly after its founding. The apostle Paul talks about elders (overseers) in 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 1:5-9. Paul talks about deacons in 1 Timothy 3:8-13.

In the Presbyterian Book of Order, deacons are described as "the Ministry of Compassion and Service" and elders are described as "the Ministry of Discernment and Government." Actively serving elders are called "the session". The session works with the pastor to take care of the business of the church. The deacons, in short, take care of the people.

Elders and deacons serve 3-year terms. During the month of October, the Congregational Nominating Committee (CNC) will gather a list of nominees who will serve through the end of 2025. The goal is to present the nominees to the congregation for a vote at a congregational meeting in November. Training for new officers will be provided after the election.

As we discern God's will for MPC through this time of pastoral transition, please prayerfully consider using your time and talents at MPC as an elder or a deacon. Perhaps God is calling you to grow in your faith, or develop new skills? This is an excellent opportunity! Remember Paul's words in Philippians 4:13: "I can do everything through him who gives me strength."
