2026 IS HERE AND SO IS OUR PARISH ASSOCIATE - REV. JEFF SIEVERT

Over the last few months we have noted the change in Rev. Jennifer Ackerman's schedule and work load as assistant professor of preaching in the School of Mission and Theology at Fuller Seminary. She will remain linked to MPC as her home church but no longer in the transitional pastor role she has blessed us with the past year.

Rev. Jeff Sievert will join us at the beginning of January and will work part-time (a little less than two days a week). Jeff retired as Pastor at Reedville Presbyterian Church after 26 years and was interested in continuing a less than full-time role that fits perfectly for MPC. Since retirement, he and his wife have been attending First Presbyterian in Portland, and he will continue to split time there as he becomes familiar with the MPC congregation. Jeff is originally from Portland and studied at Whitworth University in Spokane and San Francisco Theological Seminary. After a tenure in Nebraska at a Presbyterian church, he returned to the Portland area as pastor at Reedville Presbyterian in Beaverton.

Jeff is highly adept in preparing sermons, leading worship services, and providing pastoral care. He is skilled in directing day-to-day operations and cultivating sustainable systems when developing programs to grow ministry and outreach. He works to meet the spiritual needs of individuals of diverse backgrounds, and is eager to apply his experience and skills in a variety of different positions as MPC Parish Associate. He will be assisting with sermons, and helping with pastoral care and assorted tasks under the direction of Heather Hellman, our pastor. Please take time to welcome Jeff to MPC.

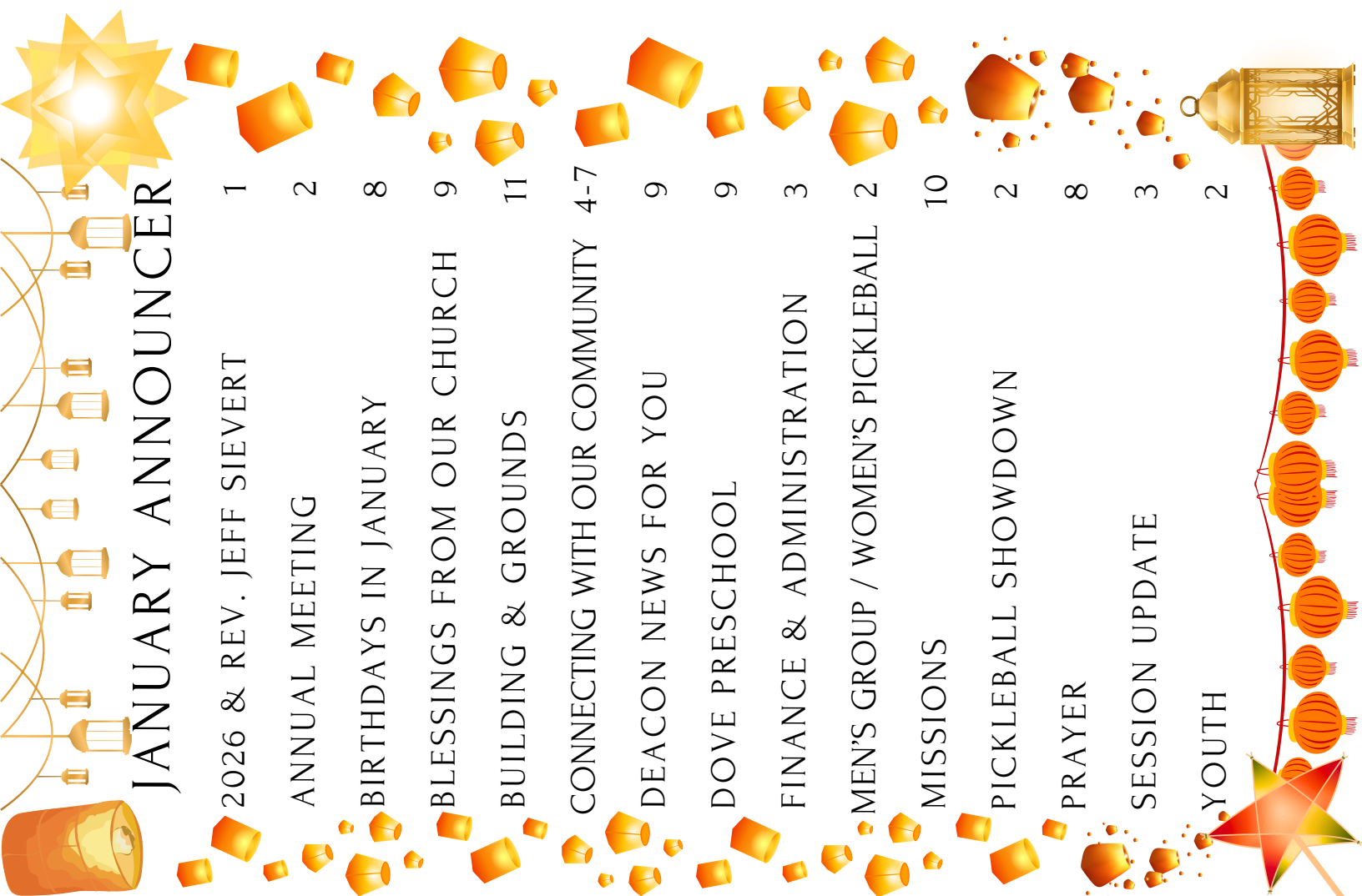
