MISSIONS MINISTRY

COLD WEATHER KITS

During the four Sundays in November, the Mission Committee will be collecting cold weather items for the houseless. On Sunday, December 4th, following the service, we will assemble kits to be distributed during the Christmas season by HOMEpdx.

The houseless are always in need of sleeping bags. If you would like to donate a sleeping a bag during this drive, the Mission Committee will deliver it to HOMEpdx along with the kits. Preferred sleeping bags are rated for cold weather, dark in color, water-proof (or accompanied by a tarp), and large enough for an adult male.

CHWELE/HARAMBEE CENTER

Grace Kuto visited with the Mission Committee and shared the news that she and her husband Paul will be moving to North Carolina to be near family. Her ministry in the village of Chwele, in Kenya, has been a blessing both to the people there and for us, to be able to be a part of it. While she will be stepping back a little, the work will continue. Our support of the clinic ambulance will continue, as well as the mental health program addressing alcoholism. But the primary attention of Harambee Center, Grace's organization, moving forward will be a scholarship program to assist teens in need of tuition help, and teen mothers. The Mission Committee approved a donation of \$300 towards the scholarship fund.

There will be a benefit dinner/African market for Harambee Center on Saturday, November 12th from 5:30pm to 8:00pm at the Tigard Community Friends Church to launch the scholarship mission and celebrate Grace and Paul.

HURRICANE IAN/DISASTER RELIEF

In October, the Mission Committee approved a donation of \$1000 to World Vision for hurricane lan relief.

SESSION UPDATE

At their last meeting, Session:

- Accepted the transfer of membership request from Libby Agosti to Columbia Presbyterian Church, Vancouver, WA, with regret.
- Authorized a brief survey of the church membership on values, priorities, expectations, etc.
- Decided to remove our membership designation in The Fellowship Community from our website, since MPC no longer participates in the Fellowship.
- Concurred with the Congregational Nominating Committee on those nominated for elders and deacons for the Class of 2024 and 2025.
- Moved \$1,000 from line item #1326 (World Vision) to line item #1316 (International Mission Discretionary) for the purpose of donating to one of MPC's mission partners (Friends of PEB) for flood/disaster relief in Pakistan.
- Called for a congregational meeting on **November 6, 2022**, for the purpose of electing elders and deacons for the class of 2024 and 2025, and a preview of the church budget for 2023.
- Elected Michael Anderson as Presbytery Commissioner for the Presbytery meeting via zoom on Nov. 4 and 5, 2022.
- Added a line item in the budget under pastor expenses for a temporary pastor.

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION

F&A Committee met on October 18th, 2022 to review our latest financial reports and continue the budget process for 2023. Budget performances for the month of September and the first nine months of 2022 are outlined below. Heather Hellman sat in representing the staff and will do so for now until we have a permanent pastor.

We ended the month with an account balance of \$ 279,045. Overall, we have a balanced budget for the year.

In our meeting we reviewed in some detail the rollup budget for the coming year. We invited Kelly Kindrick, our Personnel Committee chair, to update us on the costs and budget assumptions relating to the pastor transition that we will be undergoing in 2023. They are doing an excellent and detailed budget. This will help us plan effectively although it is hard to predict the duration of the search. We will share the preliminary numbers with Session on October 25th and then with the congregation on November 6th after our service. This will also be the kickoff of our Pledge Campaign. Please be considering strongly how important the MPC mission and activities are and plan to make a pledge. Pledge Sunday will be November 20th.

Once the pledges are in, and we have some idea of the resource we will have for the coming year, we will revise the budget accordingly and present it to the Session in January for final approval.
