PERSONNEL

The past year has been one of adaptation and transition for Multnomah Presbyterian Church. Following the departure of Pastor Danny Peters in fall of 2022, we endeavored to find a temporary transitional bridge pastor. While we advertised the position for over six months, we were not able to find a candidate who fit our needs. Given that circumstance, we lined up a series of pulpit supply from pastors in the region, starting in the spring through the end of this year. Thank you to Reverends Jeff Sievert, Dr. Bob Stebe, Conley Zomermaand, and Dr. Jennifer Ackerman for providing sermon series this year, allowing us to hear from a variety of voices. Heather Hellman has also pitched in monthly, providing her invaluable support to our Sunday service. The main feedback we heard from members through all this was a desire for greater consistency and stability in leadership during the transition.

Taking all this experience and feedback into consideration, over the last three months the Personnel Committee has



developed a staffing strategy for 2024, and in August proposed this plan to Session. This plan is being incorporated into our draft 2024 budget. It includes Heather Hellman continuing to act as Head of Staff and the Reverend Dr. Jennifer Ackerman being hired part-time to provide Pastor support. Heather is seeking approval from the Presbytery of the Cascades to become a Commissioned Ruling Elder (also known as Lay Pastor) which will allow her to perform pastoral duties at MPC during this transitional time, as established by Presbytery.

The next chapter in our transition will be seeking a permanent MPC Pastor. Our Pastor Nominating Committee continues its efforts working collaboratively with the Presbytery of the Cascades. The PNC includes Jesse Black, Dick Eyberg, Adrienne Gassaway, Valentine Hellman, Lisa Shelly, Courtney Tomastik, and Chair John England. As you all have seen from our last Pastor search (two years), this process involves many steps and takes a lot of time. At some point in 2024 we will post the position description seeking the next permanent pastor for MPC. This all depends on following through with the proper process to support this next step. We will be keeping you up to date monthly on our progress. In the meantime, always feel free to share your thoughts with our Elders or reach out directly to me (503.randy.mccourt@gmail.com).



BUILDING AND GROUNDS MPC'S CHANGING LANDSCAPE

One of the things that we often hear from members and visitors when they come to the MPC campus is the beauty of the site with all the large trees and bushes. Sadly, over the past three years, a changing climate with periods of longer and hotter temperatures and extended periods with no rain has resulted in the die off of several trees and bushes on the property. We have removed some of the small dead trees and bushes but are now faced with the realization that we are going to have to hire contractors and remove some of the larger dead and dying trees. In order to manage costs, our focus will primarily be on trees that present a potential hazard to buildings like the Open Door and to people and vehicles in the parking lot.

The predominant species of those trees dying are the Western Red Cedar and a few Large Leaf Maple. These trees make up roughly 30% of the large trees on the property. We have had arborists look at our situation, and they confirmed that most of the Western Red Cedars in Portland are facing the same fate as those on our property and may be totally gone within the next few years. Since the church property is classified as an environmental or conservation zone, there are certain restrictions put on these areas by the City of Portland which require extensive permitting such as site maps of all the trees and planting replacement trees for those trees which are removed.

And we'll have some cedar firewood available after all is said and done contact Dennis with interest.

FOSTER GRANDPARENT PROGRAM

Stay active by serving youth in local communities through AmeriCorps Seniors as a Foster Grandparent. Foster Grandparents befriend and guide children who have faced challenges. They help tutor students to excel in school, mentor teenagers and young parents, care for children with disabilities, and provide early intervention. There are flexible volunteer schedules, anywhere from 5 to 40 hours per week, serving in schools, day-care centers, and Head Start programs. .

This program is designed for people 55 and older who are living on a modest income, and offers a chance to make a little extra money while helping their community. Volunteers will receive training by the organization where they serve, cost of transportation, free meals while volunteering, as well as a non-taxed stipend per hour worked. This means that for those who are receiving other benefits based on income, such as SNAP or subsidized rent, this money does not impact that at all.

In order to ensure the safety of children, Foster Grandparent Volunteers must pass a comprehensive background check and meet income guidelines. Please call 503-545-6441 to learn more and have an application mailed to you.

YOUNG ADULTS IN THE CHURCH SUMMIT November 17 - 18 @ MPC

Churches everywhere are seeing a decline in young adult participation. We are partnering with Pivot NW Research to explore why that is and how we can welcome them back into our church.

Pivot NW Research has spent 6 years studying young adults and the church, and they are excited to share their findings with us and any churches we would like to invite. We will discover insights, engage in meaningful discussions, and enjoy free coaching. Join us Friday evening, November 17 from 7pm to 9pm and/or Saturday morning, November 18 from 9am to noon; you are welcome to attend either or both! Breakfast will be provided on Saturday.

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION

November is a very important month for all of us at MPC. It is a time of harvest, when we count our blessings and show our gratitude on Thanksgiving. We are actively preparing to celebrate the arrival of our Savior with music and worship during Advent. There is, of course, one more exciting activity that peaks in November. We will be having our congregational meeting to present a proposed budget for the coming year and ask for pledges to support the church and its many activities and missions.

In the Presbyterian tradition, developing the budget for the coming year is an interactive and collaborative process. We included a timeline of the key dates in last month's Announcer for you to use as a reference. To summarize it briefly, we have already given spreadsheets to elders and key committees to review and make their requests for next year. These requests were summarized and reviewed by both F&A and Session in October. The next step is to share this draft with all of you in a congregational meeting to get your input on how to best support the mission of MPC. This is followed by the Pledge drive in November. Once we have some idea of the resources we will have in 2024, we use December to adjust the budget accordingly. Finally, in January, the budget is approved by Session and presented to the Congregation.

It is no secret that we are a church in the middle of a significant transition period. This will make budgeting a bit more challenging this time around. Session is implementing three fundamental strategies to address these challenges. These include:

- 1. Revising the staffing plan for 2024 while we transition. This work is being done by the Personnel Committee and is outlined in their Announcer report. The revised model is now built into the budget proposal.
- 2.1.Sharing Sacred Spaces is a pilot project supported by the Presbytery to help churches find ways to bring the community into their facilities and properties to share cost and support both church and community needs. Heather Hellman and Roy Magnusson are currently participating in an 8-week program designed to identify goals and options for sharing our space. We are halfway through the program and finding it very helpful in generating potential programs for MPC.
- **3.**Becoming known as a welcoming church has been a focus of the Session discussions for several months, and many ideas are already being implemented. This work will continue in 2024 with the goal of increasing the size of our congregation.

We look forward to working with all of you over the next few months on the budget. We will need your input to be the best possible stewards of the gifts we have been given. Thank you in advance for your love and support as we transition MPC and prepare ourselves to serve Christ in the coming years.

We had a blast at the Food Trucks last month, and can't wait to do it again!
